Coaching has built a new page on the HCBC website with all the forms and information regarding the upcoming transition.



Trail of the Month

December's Trail of the Month is the Akamina Kishinena Provincial Park in the East Kootenay region.



This wilderness area along with Waterton Lakes National Park and US Glacier National Park.


preserves the Crown of the Continent UNESCO World Heritage site at the narrowest point of the Rocky Mountains. High spacious alpine ridges, deep secluded valleys and windswept passes provide habitat and connectivity to the last self-sustaining grizzly bear population in the United States. Exposed alpine ridges, southern latitude and southern exposure provide

winter range for goats and big horn sheep. The trails and passes of the Akamina-Kishinena used today to cross the axis of the continent, were established and used for many years by the early peoples and wildlife travelling between the Flathead Basin and the abundant Great Plains.
