


### Director At Large Nominations



## Animal Pedigree Act



Industry & Agriculture responded to the possible repeal of the Animal Pedigree Act (APA). HCBC wants to ensure that our members have fair opportunity to provide recommendations and comments on how changes or a repeal of the APA would affect the breed associations. The Act is under review and consultation is still open. Further information can be found on the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation website, <u>clrc.ca.</u>

APA's purpose is to promote breed improvement and to protect persons who raise and purchase animals by providing for the establishment of



animal pedigree associations that are authorized and identify animals that, in the opinion of the minister have significant value." The APA provides

- A legal framework for the operation of breed registries, registration and certification of pedigrees for both distinct and evolving breeds.
- Exclusive authority to represent breeders within Canada.
- Buyer/Seller protections.
- The establishment and operations of the Canadian Livestock Records Corporation.
- A total of 70 associations and 313 breeds across varying species are incorporated under the APA and registered 590,060 head in 2012.



### National Trail Network Project Meeting

Jen, HCBC's Recreation Coordinator, recently attended the National Trail Network Project Meeting held in Ottawa, Ontario on June 14 - 15, 2014. This meeting was hosted by Equine Canada in collaboration with Université de Sherbrooke, and included major stakeholders in the National Trail Community.The purpose of the meeting was:

- To discuss the creation of a national geo-referencing web tool and open source app to enhance communication and interaction among trail users,
- To facilitate trail development, access, and building/maintenance.
- To create a network and partnership between organizations to advocate the needs of the industry.


At the end of the meeting an Expert Group was formed to help move the project forward and to increase awareness of riding trails and trail programs in Canada, and to improve the accessibility of information on trails.




### Agricultural Land Reserve (ALR) Survey

HCBC would like to thank everyone who took the time to complete the survey sent out in May, we received a large number of responses that voiced the importance of the ALR to members. There was strong support for the preservation of agricultural land that can support crops and livestock. The majority of respondents agreed changes need to be made to update the ALR. But this should be done through dialogue with industry and an open consultation process; this is crucial for a successful agricultural base. Through our partnership with BC Agriculture Council we will present the compiled survey data to the Ministry of Agriculture for review. The intent is to initiate further dialogue and discussion between industry and government. The survey has generated interest and was noted during a meeting of the Legislative Assembly in Victoria.
