

The Local Sport Program



## From the Veterinary Officer for the Province of BC



If you are a veterinarian in BC, you are required, under legislation, to report disease. BC's recently passed Animal Health Act requires veterinarians, and anyone responsible for an animal, to notify the Office of the Chief Veterinarian for BC of any disease on the list of notifiable and reportable diseases. Many of diseases on this list duplicate the CFIA list of diseases. The benefits of the modern legislation are clear. It is important for the Province to be aware of these things because we are in touch with multiple veterinarians in multiple regions of the province and can increase awareness of these diseases, and any needed response or surveillance measures. ## Fire Safety & Disaster Planning For Your Barn

#### **ARE YOU PREPARED?**

Your horses are your responsibility. In BC there is no designated government or disaster agency responsible for the evacuation, transportation and temporary stabling of horses during large scale incidents.



With winter on its way out, you may be starting to plan your days out on the trail. What a privilege





it is to be able to enjoy both your equine companion and your beautiful community or back country at the same time! But what if that community has plans to stop you from taking your horse out on the trail?



Quite often, for seemingly unknown reasons, governments will decide to deny access to horses on trails where horses used to be allowed. Their reasons are varied and often made using information and input from only a few groups, leaving them with less than all the information needed to make an unbiased decision.

## Month is the Babine Mountains Provincial Park in the North West BC region.




This area within the Skeena
Mountains ecosection offers
some of the finest hiking
opportunities in west central British Columbia. Glacier
fed lakes, rugged peaks and extensive sub alpine
meadows provide day and overnight hiking
opportunities. Area habitat supports healthy
populations of mountain goat, moose, marmot and
many species of birds. Horses are permitted on Harvey
Mountain Trail, Silver King Basin Trail, Onion Mountain
Road and Trail, Cronin Creek Road and Trail and
Higgins Creek Trail. Horseback riders must have a
written letter of permission before heading out on the
Lyon Creek Trail. This can be obtained from BC Parks
in Smithers.

## **Book of the Month**



An Instructor's Guide to Teaching Children to Ride Author: Melissa Troup

The aim of this book is to provide new and trainee instructors with inspiration and advice on teaching children to ride, from the very first lesson. Experienced author and instructor, Melissa Troup, discusses all the basics - introducing the pony, mounting, how to sit in the

saddle, holding the reins, stopping, starting and steering, and how to teach rising and sitting trot and canter - and moves on to develop young riders' interest through dressage, jumping, cross-country and competitions. Throughout, the emphasis is on safety - and making the lessons fun. In addition to basic teaching techniques, the book looks at how to plan group and private lessons, coaching techniques for different learning styles, safety and risk assessment, child protection issues, and on-the-job problem solving. The book includes numerous example lesson plans, and there are even reproducible handouts on stable management, with illustrations and quiz-style questions, specially designed for wet-weather days and off-horse learning.
