FEI World Vaulting Championships



Vancouver I sland Victory - Capitol Region Equestrians Triumph on Lochside Trail

The Capitol Region Equestrians (CRE), a group formed to advocate for continued equestrian use of the rural sections of the Lochside Trail in the Hunt and Blenkinsop Valleys, have quietly scored a significant victory for all trail riders in the Victoria area.

The Capitol Regional District was considering paving the popular 29 kilometre, former railway corridor.

Trail of the Month

This month we feature the Lochside Regional Trail, in celebration and acknowledgement of the great advocacy work recently done by the group *Capitol Region Equestrians*, who have successfully petitioned to keep the rural sections of this lovely trail through diverse terrain accessible to trail riders. In



the revised regional plan there should be provision for continued equestrian presence on the two rural sections of the Lochside Trail in Hunt and Blenkinsop valleys.

The Lochside Regional Trail is both a popular commuting route and the perfect way to enjoy a lazy Sunday ride through the farmlands of the Saanich Peninsula. Stop at one of the nearby sandy beaches on the way, and enjoy ocean views from the trail itself as you approach Sidney This picturesque multi use trail, formerly a railway line, stretches from Swartz Bay to Victoria, past beaches, farmland, and wetlands, down country lanes and beside suburban backyards. The trail has a more civilized personality than its more rural connecting cousin, the Galloping Goose Regional Trail. While some parts of the Lochside Trail are off-road and others downright pastoral, in some places trail visitors must share paved or gravel public roads with motor vehicles and farm vehicles, and equestrians may expect to see bicycles, strollers and walkers with dogs.

I nvasive Species of the Month

We have featured Hoary Alyssum (bertaroa incana) as an invasive species



once this year, but it bears another look due to its toxicity to horses. Ingestion can be very harmful and possibly fatal to horses causing laminitis, limb edema, diarrhea, intravascular haemolysis (anemia), and hypovolemic shock (massive fluid loss).


This month we focus on prevention of further spread. Currently, Hoary Alyssum is found in south-central and southeastern BC including the Okanagan, Cariboo, Boundary, Thompson and Kootenay areas. (It is also present in the American states that border our province; see <u>this story</u> on the loss of a mare after ingesting Hoary Alyssum in Washington state.)

To do your part to prevent infestation:

- Check hay or straw bales for potential contamination and monitor for hoary alyssum on both disturbed and undisturbed sites.
- Look for seed mixtures that indicate where the seed material was collected, request only non-invasive species, and know the level of 'contamination' from your seed supplier.
- Ensure soil, gravel, and other fill material are not contaminated.
- Avoid unloading, parking, or storing equipment and vehicles in infested areas.
- Minimize soil disturbance during activities and revegetate exposed soil as soon as possible.
- Remove plants, plant parts, and seeds from personal gear, clothing, pets, vehicles, and equipment. Wash vehicles, including tires and undercarriage, and equipment at designated cleaning sites before leaving infested areas.
- Bag or tarp plants, plant parts, and seeds before transporting to a designated disposal site (e.g. landfill).
- Maintain or establish healthy plant communities that are resistant to invasion by invasive plants.
