Please don't forget to send in your Professional Development report form as soon as possible after each event you attend or participate in. To see what hours are on file in the Locker go to www.coach.ca and log into the Locker with your NCCP number and password. Your transcript and maintenance of certification information is there, however, keep in mind that there is a wait time between when you send in the PD to the office and when it shows up on your CAC transcript. The points that show up in the locker are the ones that officially count to your required amount of points. You will also be able to see your PD point collection start and end date.

Coaches and Instructors who would like to see when their First Aid and Criminal Record Search expire can log into the HCBC website using their membership number and password. Your profile will show both expiration dates. While you are there take the time to add your website address if you have one, a short Biography as well as a picture.

This book exposes the misconceptions and explores the truth of horse



positioning and bend. Readers will learn to analyze elements of horizontal balance and natural crookedness in the horse.
