

TWICE AS MANY OWLS DYING FROM RAT POISON

The number of owls dying of poisoning in B.C. more than doubled over a six-month period, according to the agriculture ministry. Five of the owls that were necropsied from October to January had likely fatal traces of rat poison, the province told Black Press Media, compared to just two between June 2016 and July 2017. Two owls died of poisoning in North Vancouver, while one was in Stanley Park and two were in Greater Victoria.

Caitlin Folvik, a raptor care assistant at Delta's Orphaned Wildlife Rehabilitation Society, said the facility has seen a spike in non-fatal poisonings too. **Poisoned owls can often be saved, Folvik said. If** you see one acting strangely, call the society's 24/7 raptor rescue line at 604-946-3171.

INVASIVE SPECIES OF THE MONTH

Baby's Breath (Gypsophila paniculata)


Common Baby's Breath is native to Eastern Europe and Western Asia and was most likely introduced to North America as an ornamental in the 1800s.

Baby's breath is an herbaceous perennial plant that invades grazing land and out-competes native and introduced perennial grasses. Plants flourish in the well-drained sandy or gravelly soils of vacant lots and along fencelines, establishing unsightly infestations.

Baby's breath that mixes with hay reduces the protein value of the crop, making it less valuable for livestock and wildlife forage. Though considered unsightly as an escaped ornamental, the delicate white or pink blooms and bushy stalks of baby's breath are used extensively in the floral industry for dried and fresh flower arrangements. Seeds often continue to develop in floral arrangements, allowing easy spread. A single plant can produce more than 10,000 seeds that can travel long distances when a complete stalk rolls freely like a tumbleweed.

A few native and ornamental alternatives to plant instead of baby's breath

include: Pearly Everlasting; Filigran Russian Sage; Hewitt'sDouble Meadow Rue; Sea Lavender; and White Flax.Did You Know? The Invasive Species Council of BC has an identificationapp! Find out more at: www.beplantwise.ca



ROAD SAFETY FOR EQUESTRIANS


Road safety for riders remains a growing concern in our communities, as the urban increasingly intersects with the rural. When you've roadproofed your horse, stocked up on high visibility gear for both of you, and made sure of your rights and responsibilities on the road, what else can you do to promote safety?

One way to do that is to work with your community planners and managers to improve awareness and signage. Recently, the advocacy group Liveable Roads for Rural Saanich (LRRS) and the District of Saanich took steps to manage speed on their roads by collaborating to design signage that signals, in the words of LRRS:

"These roads are different, they are rural and require you to slow down, and expect vulnerable users."

Municipalities have processes and systems they adhere to strictly to get things done, so a good starting point is to call your local municipal offices and ask to speak to someone about how to work with them on issues like speed and signage. By offering to be a partner, you're setting up a good relationship and that's likely to pay off for riders and municipal managers. You're also keeping equestrians on municipal radar in a positive way, which can generate its own results.


