

EC COACHES & INSTRUCTORS, YOUR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CYCLE ENDS JANUARY 1 2019.

EC Coaches and Instructors, if your Professional Development cycle ends January 1, 2019 and you have not already submitted your required PS points, you do not have much time left to complete this requirement. To check out what your cycle deadline is and to see how many points you have, go to www.coach.ca, log into the locker, when your transcript shows up, click on "maintenance". Your deadline and points on file are shown here.

If your cycle ends January 1, 2019, keep in mind that there is processing time to enter PD as well a time for it to

be approved by the CAC. Please have your PD in the HCBC office by December 1 to ensure that it is processed and approved before it's too late.

This submission deadline only applies to EC Coaches and Instructors whose PD cycle ends January 1, 2019.

provide up-to-date labour market intelligence to the agricultural industry. Beginning October 12, we invite you to complete the online survey.








