NOTES FROM CapriCMW

Why did the travel insurance change?

This question has been asked several times over the last several weeks so we thought an explanation was in order.

First, we can tell you that the previous insurer, Special Risk Insurance Managers (SRIM) abruptly withdrew their support for the HCBC travel insurance program on November 30, effective January 1, 2019. Their decision was reportedly driven by poor claims results. Although we too were frustrated by this decision, we must (all) recognize that insurers have an expectation of profit in their business and when profits diminish, they will look for other opportunities, sometimes leaving customers frustrated and searching for alternatives. It is also worth stating that the

cost of health care outside of Canada (particularly in the USA) has risen exponentially in the last several years as Governments deal with private vs public funded care and an ever aging population.

We are pleased to report that we have found an alternative travel insurance partner in TuGo Insurance who are demonstrably experienced, service driven and accommodating to our equine industry community. The terrific news is that TuGo has a flexible program. Need a single trip? No problem. Need an annual policy for multiple trips of a few weeks or several months- no problem again. 2019 EC SPORT LICENCE REQUIREMENTS FOR COACHES & INSTRUCTORS

Have you heard? EC has implemented streamlined Sport Licence fees for 2019. As part of this new structure, the minimum level of EC Sport Licence required for Certified Coaches and instructors has been revised. The revised requirements for Coaches and Instructors, which result in significantly decreased costs for those at the Instructor, Competition Coach and Coach Specialist levels, are as follows:

Instructor – Bronze Competition Coach – Bronze Coach Specialist – Silver High Performance 1 – Gold

• The \$20 EC Coach Levy remains in effect for all active coaches and

instructors.

• The changes to minimum Sport Licence requirements for coaches and instructors do not override the requirements for competitive athletes. If you plan to compete, you must maintain the Sport Licence appropriate to the level of competition you enter.

• Instructors and coaches must complete the required professional development and certification maintenance as mandated by their Provincial/Territorial Sport Organization (PTSO) to retain their "Active" status.

• Instructors who only coach within the context of the NCCP Instructor designation may continue to hold Amateur status.

• International Trainers Passport holders must maintain a Gold EC Sport Licence, at minimum.



DEADLINE FOR WELL LICENSING APPROACHING FAST

If you are using groundwater (from a well or dugout) for non-domestic uses you are legally required to submit a license application by March 1, 2019.

A water license is tied to your land and provides major benefits to your business including the protection of your water use from future developments.

If your water use began on or before February 29, 2016 and you submit your application by the deadline (March 1, 2109), government will establish your "first-in-time, first-in-right" (FITFIR) priority. This gives your water use precedence over newer users during times of scarcity.

BC YOUNG FARMERS (BCYF) LOOKING FOR APPLICANTS FOR CANADIAN YOUNG FARMERS FORUM

BC Young Farmers (BCYF) has received funding from the Canadian Agricultural Partnership program to send seven BC young farmers to the annual Canadian Young Farmers Forum (CYFF) conference that will be held in Toronto on April 5 to 7th.



Conference registration, flights and hotel will be paid by CAP. Applicants must be under the age of 40 and actively involved in a farm business. Anyone who is interested should e-mail <u>info@bcyf.ca</u> with their name, commodity, location, and a brief paragraph explaining why they would like to attend.

Deadline: February 15, 2019.

One applicant will be chosen from seven regions in BC: Vancouver Island, Fraser Valley, Kootenays, Okanagan, Cariboo, Peace, North Coast

NEW REGULATION FOR AGRICULTURAL ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT WILL REPLACE THE AGRICULTURAL WASTE CONTROL REGULATION

Effective February 28 2019, a new regulation for <u>Agricultural Environmental Management</u> will replace the Agricultural Waste Control Regulation. The new regulations increase environmental protection measures, protecting BC's water and encourage best practice for all sizes of farms.








