

HORSE COUNCIL BC & MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE ARE CONDUCTING AN EQUINE ECONOMIC IMPACT SURVEY

Horse Council BC and the BC Ministry of Agriculture are conducting a province-wide Equine Economic Impact Survey.

Whether you are a weekend trail rider, a breeder or top-rank barrel racer, your input is invaluable to the creation of an accurate study.

The past ten years have seen significant population growth, economic challenges and a changing perspective on agriculture and livestock among the general public. These attitudes have a direct impact on issues such as environmental stability and animal welfare. When you add the changes in the economy to these challenges, you can see the need for an in-depth review of the horse industry in its current state.

A healthy industry is important to all horse people. This is your opportunity to have a say on where our industry stands today.

Please watch for the release of the Equine Economic Impact Survey and take the time to complete it. Ference & Company has been engaged by Horse Council BC with funding from the BC Ministry of Agriculture to conduct an Economic Impact Study of the horse industry in BC to determine its economic benefits and values to the provincial economy. To do so, we are conducting an extensive survey of all horse owners in BC. Your decision to participate is voluntary but your views are very important. The information you provide will be protected in accordance with the Privacy Act and all information collected will be used solely for research purposes. Your responses will be summarized with other responses and reported only in summary form. Your specific responses will not be attributed to you in any report resulting from this study.





PONY TAILS KIDS CLUB

Hi Pony Tails friends,

This month I would like to introduce my new friend Deborah at Horse Lover's Math! Here is a little more about her and her program:

Horse Lover's Math - Understanding Math and Science Through Horses It has been said that the best classrooms smell like a barn. That is certainly the case with horse crazy kids. I experienced this first hand years ago when my daughter was in elementary school. She was horse crazy. We were living on a farm and leasing a pony for her, Buster. But, she struggled with math. One evening I was helping her with her math homework. We were working on a word problem, something about buying groceries, and she had little interest in finding the answer. I asked myself, what if I kept the math operations the same but changed the context of the question to be in the real world of horses?

Horse Lover's Math grew out of that moment to now offer math and STEM resources for kids who love horses. A child's passion for horses can motivate their learning not only about responsibility and hard work but STEM subjects too. Do you know a child interested in horse behaviour? Newborn foals tend to stay close to their mother's side. Over time, as the foal gets older, they venture further apart. Researchers in a Mare and Foal Behaviour Study attached GPS devices to the halters on a group of

The wild ponies of Assateague Island are given an alphanumeric code name at birth. The code helps track the maternal ancestry of each Individual pony. Kids learn how to read the code!

'SIGN HERE' – NEW ACCESS TO IMPROVED ROAD SIGNAGE FOR EQUESTRIANS

The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure (MoTI) has made a welcome change to the way equestrian warning signage is implemented

SHARE CROSSING THE ROAD NEXT XOOM on British Columbia's roads.

Effective immediately, equestrian groups around BC that would like to add or improve road signage in areas where riders must use public roads will be able to contact Ministry district and sub-district offices and ask for enhanced signage.

The familiar diamond-shaped, yellow and black profile of a horse and rider warning sign will be either installed, or if already present, augmented upon written request, by a supplementary tab stating 'Share The Road', or a tab stating the kilometre or metre count within which motorists can expect to see horses on the road, or a 'Crossing' tab.

Dr MaryJane Bowie of Rocking Horse Loop Riders in Nanoose Bay, in cooperation with the Recreation desk at Horse Council BC, worked with Ross McLean, Manager of MoTI's Provincial Sign Program and Jennifer Hardy, MoTI Senior Traffic Standards Engineer to come up with the enhancement program. On behalf of all our members, and all road riders in BC, we are grateful to Mr McLean, Ms Hardy and to the Ministry for recognizing a need and taking positive steps to address it. Road riders are encouraged to wear high visibility items such as fluorescent vests whenever they're coming into contact with vehicle traffic, and to ensure that their horses are road-trained and ready for the experiences they'll encounter.

IMPORTANT 2019 EQUINE MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAM UPDATES

In keeping with its mission to deliver safe, fair and clean sport, Equestrian Canada (EC) reviews and updates its Equine Medication Control Program on an annual basis.

The Equine Medication Control rules can be found in Chapter 10 (pages 41 to 50) of the EC General Regulations, Section A. Additional information and guidelines to assist EC Sport Licence Holders in planning their equine partners' health care can be found in the Equine Medication Control Guide.

Equine Medication Control may occur at any level (Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum) of any EC sanctioned competition. You are invited to review the EC General Regulations and the Equine Medication Control Guide for further details.

In addition, below are important updates about the Equine Medication Control Program for all levels of EC sanctioned competitions for 2019.

NEW REGULATION FOR AGRICULTURAL ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT WILL REPLACE THE AGRICULTURAL WASTE CONTROL REGULATION

Effective February 28 2019, a new regulation for Agricultural Environmental Management will replace the Agricultural Waste Control Regulation. The new regulations increase environmental protection measures, protecting BC's water and encourage best practice for all sizes of farms.

CODES OF PRACTICE TO PROTECT BC **FARM ANIMALS**

British Columbians will have new clarity on how the Province is strengthening animal welfare, with the adoption of the National Farm Animal Care Council Codes of Practice.

The codes are generally accepted management practices for owners of farm animals in B.C.

"B.C. livestock and poultry farmers have worked closely with our government to implement the National Farm Animal Care Council's Codes of Practice," said Lana Popham, Minister of Agriculture. "By accepting these codes of practice in their animal management practices, farmers and ranchers are making it clear that animals in their care are being treated with the utmost care and respect."

The codes of practice are for owners and employees, and include areas such as animal handling, feed and water, housing, health and welfare management, and husbandry practices. The codes of practice for farmers of meat livestock, poultry and fur animals is scheduled to become B.C. law on June 1, 2019.




