AGENDA GUIDELINES EC DRESSAGE JUDGE IN-PERSON PROMOTION/MAINTENANCE CLINICS

DAY 1

Welcome and Introductions of Clinicians

- Housekeeping (sign in sheets, respecting organizers, volunteers, competitors, etc.)
- Introduction from attendees
- Proposed itinerary for the day including rings, breaks, timing of activities

Theory - General

- Dressage/Para Dressage "Quiz 101" (to be distributed, handed in and scored)
- Discussion of "results" of quiz
- Highlight "What's New in our Sport" Rules Changes, etc.
- Responsibilities of the dressage judge
- EC Code of Conduct and Welfare of the Horse

Judging Theory – The Training Scale and Its' Application

- Criteria at the levels to be judged
- Focus on scale of marks
- Handling errors, penalties and eliminations
- Using the scale of marks
- Matching scores to appropriate comments
- Summary scores and comment
- Para Dressage/Young Horse/ Freestyles/Rising Stars/Equitation

Practical Judging

- To be done throughout the day, according to the competition schedule
- Assign appropriate classes for level of participants. If possible, divide participants into smaller groups for practical ringside judging.
- Clinicians may choose to judge and discuss comments and scores followed by participants judging "out loud"
- "Test judging" separate into two groups scribes/judges and assign who does what tests

Theory Review

- Return to area/room to discuss tests/comments
- Discuss plans for Day 2, timing etc.

DAY TWO

• Brief review of previous day and discussion of Agenda for the day

THEORY (continued)

- Judging theory appropriate to the level of the participants.
- Discuss appropriate scores and comments; how to get to the essence of a movement
- General discussion re judging situations; how challenging moments are handled
- Invite a steward to attend to provide input/answer questions emphasizing teamwork

PRACTICAL JUDGING RINGSIDE

- Practical judging continues, moving to higher levels
- Discussion of judging freestyles
- "Test judging" for those requesting promotion (the maintenance judges could write for those being tested)
- Final review of test judging / discussions of results
- Experience sharing
- Review of clinic, feedback

INTERVIEW OF JUDGES BEING PROMOTED

• At end of day, brief interview of promotion judges/discussion of results
