

Driving Trials - 3 phases each day (time permitting)

Driving trials will take place over 2 days of competition

Horse Council BC Rules

No cross entry between levels with the same equine

- Navigators may be under the age of 55 and should register as volunteers, unless wanting to participate in any of the Games events outside of the Equestrian Competition, then they should register as supporters
- Navigators are required for all entries except VSE and Small Ponies in the Marathon phase and for any multiple turnout competitors.
- Same qualified Navigator may be used for multiple entries
- Competitors may enter with more than one / different entries as long as they are entered in separate divisions or levels
- First competitor order of go to be determined by draw
 - a. Order – Dressage (HCBC Tests), Cones, Marathon
 - b. Divisions –
 - **Training Level Beginner** (suitable for beginner drivers or equines with less than 2 years driving experience)
 - **Training Level Open.** (Suitable for drivers or professionals with more than 2 years experience and allows experienced drivers to compete at training level)
 - **Preliminary Level Beginner** (Suitable for competitors with more than two years driving experience that want to move up from Training Open and compete with other drivers at the same skill level.)
 - **Preliminary Level Open** (Suitable for drivers or equines with more than two years driving experience at a higher level of competition and allows experienced/higher level drivers to compete with other drivers at the same skill level.)
 - c. Each level will complete 3 phases by order; order of go will change each day
 - d. Training level dressage - HCBC Driven Dressage test 1A
 - e. Preliminary level dressage - HCBC Driven Dressage test 2B

Dressage: Dressage will take place over 3 days of competition

20 x 60-meter arena

Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter between divisions.

Space permitting competitors may enter two horses, but they must be entered in different divisions

There will be no gate holds

Ride times to be determined by draw,

Ride Times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times or to facilitate the schedule

- a. Divisions
 - **Intro-** Walk/Trot, (Horses or riders in their first or second year competing)
 - **Novice-** (Training and First Level)
 - **Open-** (Second Level and Higher)
- b. Schedule permitting, two tests may be ridden each day.
- c. Equestrian Canada tests - Test 1, Test 2 and Test of Choice (TOC is for warmup only and does not count for medals), FEI I1, Prix St George
- d. Callers are allowed and must register as volunteers
- e. One whip not longer than 120 cm or 100cm for ponies, is permitted

Western Dressage: Western dressage will take place over 3 days of competition

20 x 60-meter arena

Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter between divisions.

Space permitting competitors may enter two horses, but they must be entered in different divisions

There will be no gate holds

Ride times to be determined by draw,

Ride Times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times or to facilitate the schedule

a. Divisions –

- **Intro-** (Walk Jog), (Horses or riders in their first or second year competing)
- **Novice-** Training, First Level)
- **Open-** (Second Level and Higher)

b. Schedule permitting, two tests may be ridden each day.

c. HCBC tests - Test 1, Test 2 and Test of Choice (TOC is for warmup only and does not count for medals)

d. Callers are allowed and must register as volunteers

Working Equitation: Working Equitation will take place over 2 days of competition

WECan/HCBC Rules

Same horse/rider combination may not cross enter between divisions.

Space permitting competitors may enter two horses, but they must be entered in different divisions

There will be no gate holds

Ride times to be determined by draw,

Ride Times will only be changed in the case of error, overlapping times or to facilitate the schedule

Order - Dressage, Ease of Handling Obstacles, Speed Trial

Divisions/Levels - Intro, Novice A, Novice B, Intermediate, Advanced

Working Hunter

Horse Council BC Rules

Space permitting competitors may enter two horses, but they must be entered in different disciplines

There will be no gate holds

First day order of go over fences to be determined by draw,

a. Divisions

- Novice (horses and riders in their first or second year of competition)
- Open (experienced competitors)

b. Not to have jumped over 2'9" in competition in the previous or current year

c. Hunter Hack, horses to be shown at the walk, trot and canter, and to jump a line of two fences no higher than 2'3". Distance between the two Hunter hack fences will not be changed for ponies)

d. 2'3" Low (this is a warmup class and does not count for medals)

e. 2'3" Working Hunter over Fences

f. Hunter Hack

g. 2'3" Working Hunter over Fences

h. 2'3" Hunter Derby (with 2'6" options)
